Prof. Hans-Georg Schaible, Prof. Frank Richter and ESR8 Fátima Gimeno-Ferrer, TOBeATPAIN partners from the University of Jena, joined hundreds of physiologists working in Germany, Austria, Switzerland and other countries to hear well recognized experts in the field of pain research and neurodegenerative diseases organised in conjunction with the Austrian Physiological Society and Life Sciences Switzerland.

Prof. Richter and Fátima Gimeno-Ferrer gave a poster presentation entitled “Amplitudes and propagation of cortical spreading depolarization (CSD) in adult rats are influenced by Clacitonin gene-related peptide (CGRP)” (Gimeno-Ferrer F, Richter F, Bauer R, Lehmenkühler A, Schaile H-G, 2019). This showed the first promising results of Fátima’s project regarding the homeostasis alteration in a neuroinflammation model

A particularly notable Symposium entitled “Novel perspectives in the pathophysiology of the nociceptive systems”, was hosted by TOBeATPAIN Partner and Work Package 3 Research leader Prof. Michaela Kress from the University of Innsbruck.

There were several sessions of particular relevance for TOBeATPAIN: “Neuro-Glial interaction in health and disease”, “Novel approaches in neurodegenerative diseases” and “Nociception and pain in humans.
